Relevance

- Keeping up to date on local and big picture agendas
- Having expertise on local neighbourhoods and their communities
- Being innovative and creative in response to local needs/interests

Resource

- Revenue policies
- Finance and asset management
- Councillor and staff skills for policy development & strategic planning
- New ways to deliver services

- Building trust
- Openness and accountability

What are the critical roles and skills for the future of local government?

- **Re-thinking the role of councillors** as community connectors, brokers and leaders
- **Stewardship** – more than making decisions but keeping in touch with the community and knowing how the community is doing
- **Community engagement** - implement new ways of engaging with the community - citizen juries, participatory budgeting, citizen assemblies, council advisory committees, neighbourhood forums

2. Engaging with Yarra

The City of Yarra's **Engagement Policy and Action Plan 2020 - 2024** sets out a hierarchy of engagements to be implemented across the Council administration.

- Empower – *‘building the capacity of the community to identify solutions and / or lead change.’*

Pandemic impact - Opportunities

- Increased social connections and volunteering
- Increase use of open space, walking, cycling, get togethers
- Creative use of public space, parklets, pop up parks, use of roundabouts, median strips
- Strengthening governance and participation though virtual meetings and webinars
- Smaller and manageable public art events
